Resident Resources

PREPARE YOUR HOME AND YARD FOR COOLER TEMPERA-TURES

Outdoor Tasks:

- Plug in your heat tape.
- Disconnect hoses from outdoor spigots. Drain and store
- Store outdoor furniture, cushions, toys, etc.
- Rake leaves and shred to use as mulch, or dispose of them with biodegradable bags available at the office.
- Walk around your home's exterior and check for loose skirting. Close any that are open.
 Replace any with holes.
- Protect your central air conditioning unit with a cover
- Clean and store garden tools.
- DO NOT USE deck, porch, or patio as storage areas.

Indoor Tasks:

- Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors when you set clocks back Saturday night, November 5.
- Check windows and doors for weathertightness and install weather stripping where it's needed.
- Change furnace filters 1/1, 4/1 7/1 and 10/1.
 Have furnace professionally inspected.
- If needed, set traps for rodents.
- Reverse those ceiling fans again. They should blow upward (clockwise) in the winter to push warm air across ceilings and down walls.

Requesting Rent, Utility

or other Housing Assistance

Waypoint is acting as the centralized intake for rent and utility assistance throughout Linn County. New applicants in Linn County may contact Waypoint Services at 319-366-7999 and leave a message to assess eligibility for available rent and utility assistance sources.

The Waypoint Housing Services Team has lots of different options. The quickest way to get through the system is go online to the Iowa Coordinated Intake Portal (website below), and prefill information. Waypoint's team will call applicants back within 24-hours. To move even quicker through the system, residents should have copies of bills, income, lot rent, identification, etc. ready.

DON'T GET SCAMMED

Scammers, crooks and thieves are using some old tricks—and finding new ones—to separate you from your hard-earned money. Whether it's by email, text, phone, or letter, BE ALERT to these signs:

- Scammers pretend to be someone you trust. They make themselves believable by pretending to be connected to a friend or family member.
- Scammers create a sense of urgency. They rush you into making a quick decision before you look into it.
- Scammers use intimidation and fear. They tell you that something terrible is about to happen to get you to send a payment before you have a chance to check their claims.
- Scammers use untraceable payment methods. They often want payment through wire transfers, reloadable cards, Venmo, or gift cards that are nearly impossible to reverse or track.

Remember: email addresses, text messages, and web sites that look legitimate are easy for scammers to fake. Stop and THINK about whether it could be a scam before you click.






If snow is not removed from in front of the garage and drifts occur, melting snow may back wash into your garage and damage belongings stored on the floor.
