Hames Offices are Going Cashless

Start Getting Ready

In order to keep our staff and residents safe, as of **September 1, 2023** Grand View and Summit View will **no longer accept cash payments** for home site rent, fees, Community Room rentals, security deposits, home loan payments, skirting, or parts purchases. This is consistent with other area landlords.

If you currently use cash, there are numerous other ways to pay:

- Sign up in your community office for <u>free</u> automatic debits from your bank account. Payments for home site rent and wastewater are deducted automatically on the 1st or 3rd (your choice) of each month.
- Circle Finance has the same <u>free</u> direct debit option for house payments. Contact Cynthia or Danielle at

- 1. Credit and Debit Cards: Master Card, Visa, and Discover Cards.
- 2. Personal checks, money orders, or cashier's checks.

For residents that may not have a checking account, Linn Area Credit Union and Veridian Credit Union both offer no-fee savings accounts with \$5.00 minimum to open and maintain that balance. You can request Debit Card access to your account. Other options are online banking and loadable credit cards (some have fees). Search the internet for "reloadable free cards" for more information. Thank you for helping keep our communities safe. We hope this 5 month notice helps relieve any inconvenience.

Please come into the Summit View or Grand View Office <u>BEFORE</u> you set up a pool, spa or trampoline and provide your insurance declaration ("dec") page which shows proof of Liability Insurance.

If you have Foremost Insurance through Hames, let us know and we will get a copy of the dec page for your file.



Rent Reimbursement and

Property Tax Credit Forms

Applications are now available online at and at Community Offices.

For Rent Reimbursement: Eligibility is age 65 in 2022 or 18 and totally disabled and having an income of \$25,328 or less for 2022.

If you qualify the reimbursement can be as much as \$1,000. The lower your income, the larger the refund. Come to the office to get a copy of your 2022 rent statement, you will need to send it with the application.

For Property Tax Credit:

Must be at least 23 years of age in 2022. This may give you a \$.01 per square foot discount, or the maximum, which may reduce your tax bill to nothing. Your income for the household must be \$25,327.99 or less. Do your paperwork right away as both have a deadline of June 1, 2023.

Habitat for Humanity

Habitat for Humanity has an affordable repair program. You must apply, there are fees, and "sweat equity" requirements. There are income guidelines by family size. Proof of hardship may get some fees waived. For senior citizens, the sweat equity is waived.

Assistance may be provided up to \$2,000 on your home and you're required to contribute 5 hours of your own labor.

Matthew 25 may be able to assist those who qualify for repairs in manufactured homes. Contact Jessica 319-362-2214 with Matthew 25 main office to get an application to see if you qualify for help.

Pick-up Pet Waste or Get Reported!

Repeat offenders: If you don't respond to Community Management's requests to clean up pet waste, you will be reported to Cedar Rapids Animal Control and fines may be levied.

Lawn and Landscaping Basics

- ⇒ It's almost time to store all cold weather equipment (like snow shovels and sleds) away for spring and summer.
- ⇒ Mow regularly and trim same day. Don't forget to trim the utility pedestals.
- ⇒ When you're mowing, we suggest using a mulching mower so the grass will give nutrients to your lawn. Also, please sweep up excess grass blown into the street.
- ⇒ Has grass taken over your garden? Are weeds taking over your landscaping? If you don't have time to redo your landscaping now, please pull weeds and grasses and spray with a weed killer. There are some products out now that last 3-4 months.
- ⇒ Dead weeds in landscaping look as bad as green ones, so be sure to remove them!
- ⇒ Do not put edging around your mailbox, street light, or near the curb. **Stay one foot away**. While it looks beautiful during the warm months, edging near the curb can be damaged by snow removal equipment. We plow as close to the curb as we can in winter, which can damage your plants and tear out brick edging.
- ⇒ Landscape yards or do some sprucing up by adding **ornamental bushes and plants.** Keep in mind that what is planted needs to be maintained.
- ⇒ For best results, **ask management** to preapprove landscaping. When planning your landscaping, make sure you submit a drawing to the community office. You will want it easy to maintain throughout the growing season.

Remember to call **IOWA ONE CALL** (underground locators) 48 hours before digging. It's free. It's the law.


Place at Curb in Paper Bags
