# Water Line Freeze-Ups Call Your Community First!

lowa's bitter cold temperatures can be hard on water lines. Remember these helpful tips:

#### Do:

- Make sure your heat tape is plugged in and working. Always hire a capable plumber or home repair company. It's your best defense against having broken water lines.
- Notify your on-call Manager right away if you have no water. If it's a
  freezing issue, we can protect the meter and underground pipes and save
  you money.
- ◆ If your community office notifies you of a spike in water usage—don't ignore it! Look around and under the home. If you can't explain the water loss, let your office know right away. We can have the Manager check the water lines and secure the meter. You will still need to hire a capable plumber or home repair company to find the leak and repair it.

#### Don't:

 Ignore a possible freeze-up, it can lead expensive broken lines and/or costly meter replacements.

Patients do not have to be residents of Linn County to receive services at the Access Center. The Access Center is located at 501 13<sup>th</sup> St. NW in Cedar Rapids.

**Do not dispose of** these items in the regular dumpsters:

- All appliances including anything with electrical motors, humidifiers small appliances.
- Waste motor oil, paint (empty dry paint cans are ok).
- Dead animals.
- Batteries do not go in garbage and the landfill will take them without an additional charge. You need to take them there and tape over terminals so there is less fire hazard.
- Tires
- Corrugated cardboard boxes must be broken down and placed in recycle containers.

# ICE & SNOW: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

It's Winter.

Love it or hate it, it's reality in Iowa. To more easily cope with ice and snow, check out this Q&A

**Q:** If it snows overnight, will my street be plowed by morning?

**A:** Hames plow drivers are called in during the night based on snowfall. We will plow if we feel that we can make improvements to the streets condition.

**Q:** Hames plow drivers cleared the snowbut didn't put down sand or salt, why?

**A:** Salt and sand are spread as needed. If the snowfall is so heavy that the area would be re-plowed soon, the salt and sand would be quickly plowed and wasted.

Q: Must I plow my own driveway?

**A:** Yes, each resident is responsible for making sure their driveway is cleared. Please plow around your mailbox also.

**Q:** Why does the plow leave snow at the bottom of my driveway?

A: It's unavoidable. As the plow moves down the street, it pushes snow to the right where you'r driveway happens to be. If we removed snow from the bottom of each drive, there wouldn't be time to plow all of the streets.

Q: How are sand and salt different?

**A:** Sand doesn't dissolve ice: it's used when traction is needed. Hames maintenance staff use salt and de-icing material as needed, without oversalting which is bad for stormwater runoff.

Q: Where can my guests park vehicles?

**A:** NO vehicles are allowed in the streets during plowing. Make arrangements for your visitors' vehicles to be off the street. Call your community office if you need assistance.

**Q:** What about fire hydrants outside my home?

**A:** Clear the area of snow for emergency use. If you will be gone in the winter, please let the office know.

**Remember:** Hames maintenance crews work 24 hours a day until snow is cleared so for your safety. Community streets are usually cleared sooner than city streets!

So, next time you see Brett, Jonny, Tony, Daniel, Sean or Andrew, tell them "thank you".

# **Pet Vaccinations**

#### PLEASE READ!

There are 434 dogs and 288 cats registered in Grand View and Summit View. Per City code, they must ALL show proof of rabies shots to live in Hames communities. With so many fur-babies, that's a LOT of vaccinations for our Office Administrators to track down. (continued below)

Unvaccinated pets are a risk to everyone. PLEASE, get your pets vaccinated regularly and REMEMBER to give the office a copy of the veterinarian's immunization record. Even "indoor" cats must have rabies shots.

If your veterinarian says that your pet may NOT get rabies shots for medical reasons, we need a WRITTEN STATEMENT from the doctor annually.
